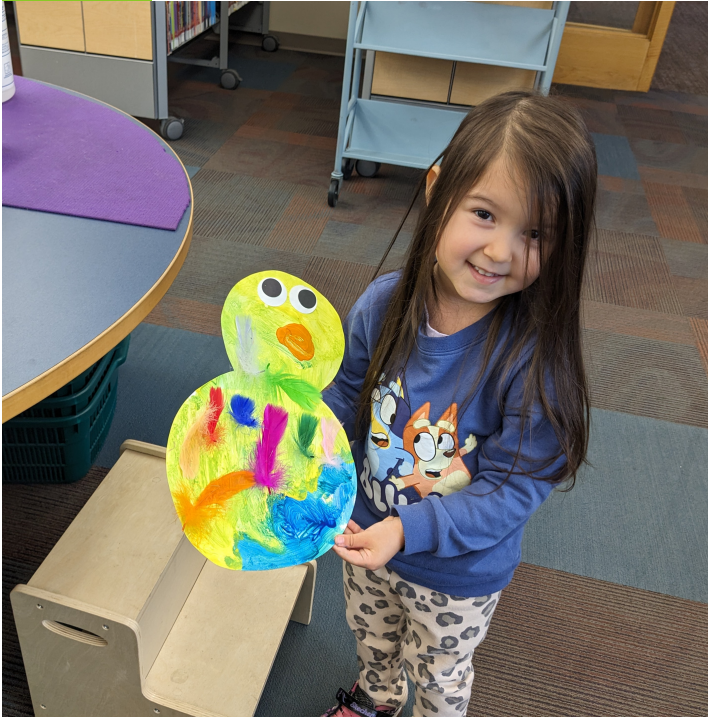

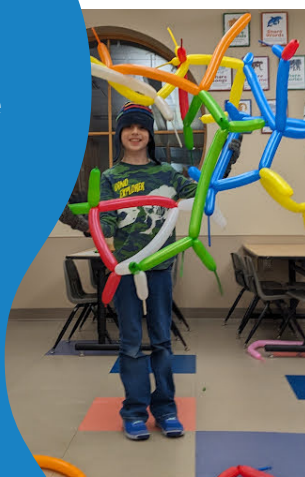
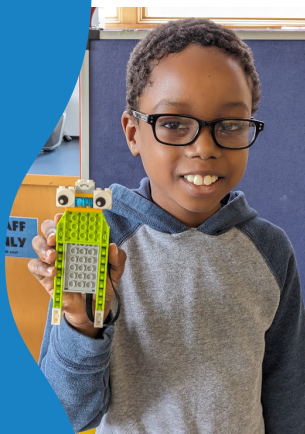

Explore and create art from methods used by master artists or art movements.

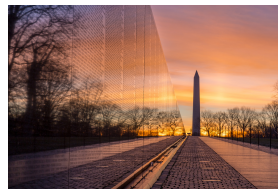
Monday, Mar. 18 from 6:30–7:30 pm: Fabergé Egg
